On Wednesday, November 9, 2011, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Center for Economic Education will again sponsor **Economics Day for Students** on the UNL campus. Co-sponsoring the event includes the UNL Economics Department, the Nebraska Council on Economic Education and the College of Business Office of Admissions.

**Economics Day for Students** brings together 200 high school juniors and seniors from across our state to the UNL campus. The purpose of the day is to introduce these students to the exciting area of economics, the College of Business Administration, and UNL in general. We invite you to recruit/select the students to attend.

The students would meet at 8:45 AM at the Student Union. From approximately 9:00 - noon they would interact with UNL faculty on topics related to the areas of microeconomics, macroeconomics, and international economics. Have your students write questions related to macroeconomics, microeconomics, or international economics on 3X5 cards which will then be given to the faculty as part of the discussion in these sessions. The morning will include a break of juice and doughnuts sponsored by the Economics Department.

Following lunch on your own in the Nebraska Student Union, you may register your students for guided tours of campus, including the College of Business Administration (home of the Economics Department). The tours are only 45 minutes. The entire program will conclude by 1:45. Parking for busses is available off of 14<sup>th</sup> Street, North of the Devaney Center. I recommend using the parking garages if arriving by van or car.

This event is a stimulating and informative day for all students and teachers involved. Since we are limiting participation to the first 200 students, please inform me of your plans as soon as possible, but no later than **Friday, October 7**.
