**William Walstad** organized and directed with Michael Watts (Purdue) an International Symposium in San Francisco that was co-sponsored by the Committee on Economic Education of the American Economic Education, the National Council on Economic Education and the Journal of Economic Education. It featured papers analyzing the status of economic education in universities and schools in four nations (Australia, Japan, Korea and the United Kingdom).



**Ann Mari May's** paper, "Representation of Women Faculty at Public Research Universities: Do Unions Matter?" has been accepted for publication in the *Industrial and Labor Relations Review*. The paper is co-authored with Elizabeth A. Moorhouse and Jennifer A. Peterson.

The UNL Teaching Council and the UNL Parents Association awarded 4 Economics faculty members and a doctoral student with a "Certificate of Recognition for Contributions to Students". Parents of a UNL student recognize the named professors as having "had a significant contribution to their (students') lives while at UNL." The paper is co-authored with Robert Diman. The article will appear in the Spring 2009 issue.

**Ann Mari May** and her co-editors, Lourdes Beneria of Cornell University and Diana Strassmann of Rice University, have a three volume set titled, *Feminist Economics* that will be published in 2009. The 3 volume series is part of the prestigious International Library of Critical Writings in Economics series, Mark Blaug, editor and will be published by Edward Elgar.
